B Oh right, I knew that. But let me write that in my notebook anyway or I might forget it again.
A Sure, go ahead.

- A So, any other questions?
B No, but I like this part, "the second highest mountain." I didn't know how to say that. I guess I'm the second tallest in my family.
A Why not write it in your notebook?
B Good idea. Hang on.

- B So, how about my transcription? Any questions about mine?
A Yeah, what's this? "Lead a satisfying life." "Lead?"
B Yeah, you can use "lead" to mean "live" or "have" when you are talking about life.
A I see. So you mean, "have a happy life."
B Yeah, something like that. Anything else?
